- 1. The Pre-Trial Chamber notes that it has three requests before it which have been made during and prior to the hearing and were argued:
 - 1- To hear Dr. Falke before the Pre-Trial Chamber;
 - 2- To adjourn the hearing because of the health condition of the Charged Person;
 - 3- To continue with the hearing to allow the Co-Lawyers of the Charged Person to make submissions as to why the health issue is crucial for the Pre-Trial Chamber's consideration.

2. On the First Request:

The Pre-Trial Chamber finds that the Request is to hear Dr. Falke as a witness and not to appoint him as an expert. The evidence he can provide is indirect. The Request is therefore denied.

3. On the Second Request:

The Request to adjourn the hearing on the Appeal is granted because of the health condition of the charged person. The Pre-Trial Chamber finds the medical report of the Doctor of the Detention Centre which was provided to the Pre-Trial Chamber just before this hearing, sufficient to lead to this conclusion.

4. On the Third Request:

The Pre-Trial Chamber notes that the Co-Lawyers have submitted that the issue in respect of the Charged Person's health they want to raise is part of their appeal.

The Pre-Trial Chamber therefore finds that the issue should be raised within the nearing deal with the whole of the appeal.

The Pre-Trial Chamber further notes that at the moment no further application has been filed of a more specific nature as suggested by the Pre-Trial Chamber in its decision of the 23rd of February 2009.

THEREFORE, THE PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER HEREBY DECIDES:

To adjourn the hearing to the 2nd of April 2009 at 9:00 a.m.
